Two Residents From the Cranberry Road Have Trouble

Two residents of the Cranberry Road, W. J. Pomeroy and Henry Greens have been at variance with each other, with the result that a Police Court session was held this morning to settle their differences. Pomeroy charged Greens with assault and threatening to do him bodily harm.

It appears that two Barnardo Home girls were employed by Mr. Greens, and on Friday, 7th inst., they came to Mr. Pomeroy's residence and complained of being ill treated and asked for protection. When Mr. Greens came after them Mr. Pomeroy did not give them up and this was the commencement of the trouble. The following morning Mr. Greens called Mr. Pomeroy to the gate, and after a brief discussion, he struck Mr. Pomeroy in the face and threatened to do him further bodily harm.

Mr. Greens admitted striking the plaintiff, and stated that he phoned the authorities at the Barnardo Home to take the children back because he could not depend upon anything they said.

Mr. Pomeroy sent word to the authorities of the Barnardo Home, and a representative of that institution came down and took the girls back with him.

His Worship imposed a fine of \$2.00 and \$4.00 costs upon the defendant.

DOCTOR PROBING INTO BACON.

Dr. Owen is Excavating in the River of a Cipher, Which Says That the Chancellor's Manuscripts Are Buried Under a Great Box—His Has Already Found an Array of Piling.

England's antiquaries and Shakespearean scholars are following with diligent care the accounts of the discoveries which are being made in the mud of the River Wye, near Chepstow. Dr. Orville W. Owen, of Detroit, a Shakespearean scholar of world-wide repute. The British public is also greatly interested in Dr. Owen's work. When the search was first begun a few weeks ago England greeted Dr. Owen with equal parts of congratulatory silence and open ridicule.
